5. IV Therapy – a routine nursing task? – (Group 5) – **17th Dec ‘10**
6. Renal Calculi, types, causes and interventions. – (Group 6) – **21st Dec ‘10**
7. Screening for breast cancer - A commodity or necessity? – (Group 7) - **17th Dec ‘10**
8. Intestinal obstruction – a critical affair. – (Group 8) – **21st Dec ‘10**
9. Pelvic Inflammatory Disease. – (Group 9) - **17th Dec ‘10**

Students in groups will have a **whole hour** to their **disposition** to present their respective topic. A hard and soft copy of the presentation material should also be presented to the module coordinator on the date of the groups' presentation.

Presentation assessment marking will be based on the following criteria:

Content (40 marks); Creativity (15 marks); Clarity of presentation (15 marks); Voice and delivery (10 marks); Timing (10 marks); & Generating group discussion (10 marks).

Referencing of material and Presentation should be given great importance.

Students are allowed to hand in one draft of their work to the module co-ordinator before presenting and submitting the final product.
